Visitors from other denominations must appear to make their request at the consistory meeting prior to communion. If we cannot administer the sacrament to you, we are not judging whether or not you are a child of God; we are simply recognizing the reality that there is not

at this time doctrinal agreement between our respective church bodies. Please respect our desire to be faithful to God's Word in this matter
