Today we begin singing new doxologies at the close of our services. In the morning we will make use of doxology #9 “Gloria Patri” and in the evening doxology #10 “May the Grace.” The words of these doxologies are printed on the back of the bulletin.

The consistory approved the request of Mr. and Mrs. Kevin Eppinga for their membership papers to be sent to their home.

The consistory, after carefully considering its effect on our pastor's workload, approved a proposal that the Young People's Society and the Creeds class meet every other week, on alternative Sunday mornings, rather than weekly, beginning in September. The benefits will be that our pastor can lead both and that the high school seniors will be able to attend Young People's Society.

The consistory approved the 2025-2026 catechism season beginning on August 27, for the Wednesday evening classes and on Tuesday, September 2, for the Bible History Classes. The Creeds class (12th grade) will be held alternative Sunday mornings after the worship service.
