FROM THE COUNCIL

After a week of self-examination, confessing members in good standing are called and privileged to partake of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper this morning. Our participation in the Lord's Supper is a witness that we repent of our sins, believe that Jesus Christ is our righteousness, and desire to live in godliness. As this heavenly food can be taken to one's judgment (I Cor. 11:28-30) and as the receiving of this food as a congregational body is a confession of doctrinal oneness (Acts 2:42), the elders supervise the partaking of the sacrament. If you are visiting from another PRC congregation, please contact the elders before communing. Visitors from other denominations must appear to make their request at the consistory meeting prior to communion. If we cannot administer the sacrament to you, we are not judging whether or not you are a child of God; we are simply recognizing the reality that there is not at this time doctrinal agreement between our respective church bodies. Please respect our desire to be faithful to God's Word in this matter.

The sacrament of baptism will be administered next Sunday morning to Kenna Joy, infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jordan Kooima, and to Annie Rose, infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dillon Brummel.

Pastor Brummel was assigned a Classical appointment to Spokane, WA, to preach for the fellowship which is under the oversight of Lynden PRC. Rev. Ron Hanko has been providing pastoral labors but will be gone the Sundays of November 2 & 9. Pastor and Crysta plan to leave on Saturday, November 1, and will return home on Monday, November 10, Lord willing. Prof. Cory Griess and an area pastor will provide supply for November 2. On November 9 an elder will lead our morning service and we plan to hold our second service at 2:00 p.m. so that an area pastor can preach for us.

The consistory approved the requests of Cornerstone PRC to take oversight of Daniella Boer and of Crete PRC to take oversight of Sara Holleman during this upcoming year at Dordt University. We welcome these young ladies to our congregation and pray God's blessings on them in their time with us.

The council approved a recommendation of the building committee to make repairs to our church sign due to oxidation from water getting into the sign. Wink's masonry was hired for \$4,250 to replace the limestone caps, acid wash the sign, seal it, and make improvements to wick any water out that might enter the sign.
