DENOMINATIONAL NEWS

Rev. D. Kleyn declined the call from Bryon Center PRC to serve as minister-on-loan to the Philippines.

Rev. S. Regnerus declined the call from Southwest PRC.

Hope PRC (Redlands, CA) has formed a trio of Rev. H. Bleyenbergh (Immanuel PRC), Rev. G. Eriks (Unity PRC), and Rev. J. Smidstra (First PRC).

Classis East met this past week. Much of the business of classis had to do with two cases that were treated in closed session. Classis also treated a protest against a decision Classis East made in January to declare illegal an overture that proposed asking synod to adopt the New King James Version for official use in the denomination alongside the King James Version. Classis upheld the protest (deciding that it was an error to declare the overture illegal in January). Classis then declared the overture legal, which led to classis deliberating on whether or not to approve the overture. Classis decided not to approve the overture. This means that Classis will not send the overture to Synod with its approval. Those who brought the overture have the option not to pursue the matter any further or to send the overture to Synod without the approval of Classis East. Classis adopted a pulpit supply schedule for the vacant churches of Faith, Grace, and Southwest PRCs. The next meeting of Classis East will convene on September 9, 2026 at Grandville PRC. Classis adjourned a little before 2:30 PM on Thursday. May God use the decisions of Classis East for His glory and for welfare of our churches.
