DENOMINATIONAL NEWS

Synod of the Protestant Reformed Churches met this past Tuesday through Friday at Hope PRC. News reports of each day are available on the website: www.prc.org. There are a few copies of the summary reports available on the octagon table in the narthex.

With gratitude to God, Synod informs the churches and sister churches of the PRCA that Synod unanimously approved the synodical examination of Mr. Bruce Feenstra and declares him a candidate for the ministry of the word and sacraments in the PRCA. Mr. Feenstra is eligible for a call on or after July 11, 2026, and upon receipt of a call has six weeks to consider that call.

Faith PRC has formed a new trio of Rev. G. Eriks (Unity PRC), Rev. J. Maatman (Southeast PRC), and Rev. J. Smidstra (First PRC-Holland).

Southwest PRC has formed a new trio of Rev. D. Holstege (Wingham PRC), Rev. J. Maatman (Southeast PRC), and Prof. Gritters. They plan to call from this trio today.

QUOTES FOR CONTEMPLATION

"...The church is a community. The word community means literally "to be one with." The church is a community of brothers and sisters who are redeemed, regenerated, and traveling together as pilgrims in this world to their heavenly home. The church's oneness has nothing to do with the superficial bonds that bring so many together today: neighborhoods, sports, food, work, or ethnicity. The church is a community of those who are one in Christ although we are all very different. God made His church a community of saints who know Jesus Christ and live to serve Him with heart, mind, soul, and strength. Together we are saints! We are not super-Christians who have done remarkable things. We are common, ordinary saints who suffer and sin. What brings us together is our common need for the cross of Christ Jesus to free us from sin and to comfort us in our suffering.

This idea of community has been hijacked by our digital age. In these communities "friendship" is based on a false reality of snippets of life shared with a community of followers to make everything look fantastic or to find sympathy. But fellowship enjoyed in the church must be richer and deeper than this. It is fellowship for the sake of the gospel and is a reflection of God's covenant with us. It is fellowship reflecting the deep, deep love of God for us in Jesus Christ and a desire to grow in being Christ-like.
